  - Jeff Heiser: Regarding the \$250,000 in increased maintenance, \$120,000 was for lighting upgrade at the Youth Center. \$140,000 in rooftop repairs. Regarding student vet position at the Equestrian Center, boarders pay for their own vet services. Campus Rec pays for horses that they manage in the herd. Regarding law students, 400 unique law users came to Campus Rec over the calendar year. 10,000 visits at the ARC from law students.
