Dear Chancellor May:

Attached you will find a copy of the 2020-21 Advisory Letter from the Council on Student Affairs and Fees (COSAF). The letter serves as a final summary of recommendations from the council regarding campus-based fees. The council is recommending CPI adjustments to student fees, effective Fall 2021, that will help mitigate increased costs in units dependent on these funds. We concur with the recommendations and advise you to approve the fees as outlined in COSAF's letter. Please note that the ASUCD and Unitrans fee increases reflect multi-year increases (beyond CPI) that were approved in recent years by student referenda. Also, The Green Initiative Fund mentioned in the letter will sunset because the recent ASUCD elections did not have sufficient voter turnout to reinstate the fee for 2021-22.

Highlights of the council's work this year includes:

- The council heard 42 presentations from campus departments and student groups, which resulted in **250+ recommendations** provided to us throughout the year.
- The council reviewed data on \$89,600,000 in **Campus-Based and Student Services Fees**.
- The council approved and disbursed \$101,644 in Student Services Fee funds for one-time funding of **student programs** that will take place in 2021-22.
- The council reviewed 26+ applications for **Student Development** funds and awarded \$11,040 to the qualified applicants.
- COSAF co-chairs joined their peers on the **UC Council on Student Fees** and attended three virtual meetings and conference calls throughout the year.

We applaud the students' engagement and participation on this fee committee. We are happy to address any questions you may have. If you concur with COSAF's fee recommendations, we ask that you indicate your approval by signing below. We will then notify COSAF and the appropriate administrative departments of your decision.



RE: Campus Based Fees for 2021-22

Dear VC Reguerín and VC Ratliff,

The Council on Student Affairs and Fees (COSAF) has spent this year reviewing the use of campus-based fees by departments who receive the funding. These reviews were conducted to assure appropriate use of the revenue and to determine whether to recommend CPI adjustments for those fees eligible.

The attached document provided by Budget & Institutional Analysis reflects a comprehensive look at 2020-21 fees based on COSAF recommendations. The report includes recommended **CPI adjustments** for **CEI, FACE, LEEAP** and **GSA**. Also, **SASI** fee recipients presented this year and the Council has provided their recommendations to the departments. Per referendum language, SASI receives an automatic CPI adjustment.

Referring to page two, all fees are listed separately for undergraduate students, who will see a proposed **\$69.30** total increase in campus-based fees and graduate/professional students, who will see a proposed **\$9.96** increase.

In addition, this year COSAF reviewed and provided ballot language recommendations for The Green Initiative Fund Renewal Referendum and recommended that the referendum be placed on the ASUCD Spring 2021 ballot. If this referendum passes by vote of the student body, the fee will take effect in Fall 2021.

We will soon be producing an annual report that will further describe the activities of the 2020-21 Council with detailed COSAF recommendations, including input on five **Student Services Fee** department presentations and allocation of up to \$100,000 in **Student Programming Funds**. We hope you will find these recommendations helpful to Student Affairs and FOA in its efforts to create a positive and meaningful campus experience for every UC Davis student.

After thorough review, we take great honor in providing these student fee recommendations on behalf of the UC Davis student body. COSAF looks forward to our partnership with you next year as we continue to listen and understand the use of Campus Based fees here on our campus.
