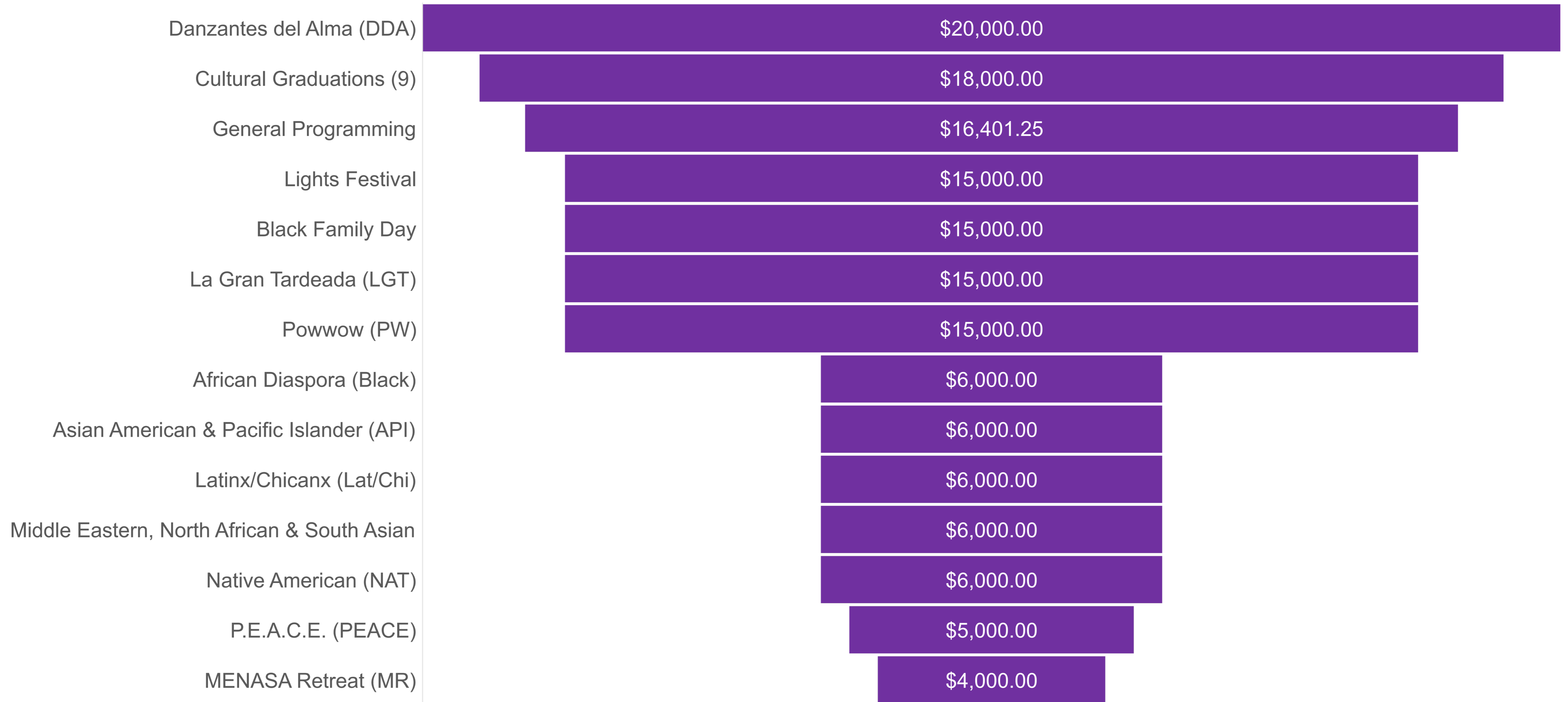

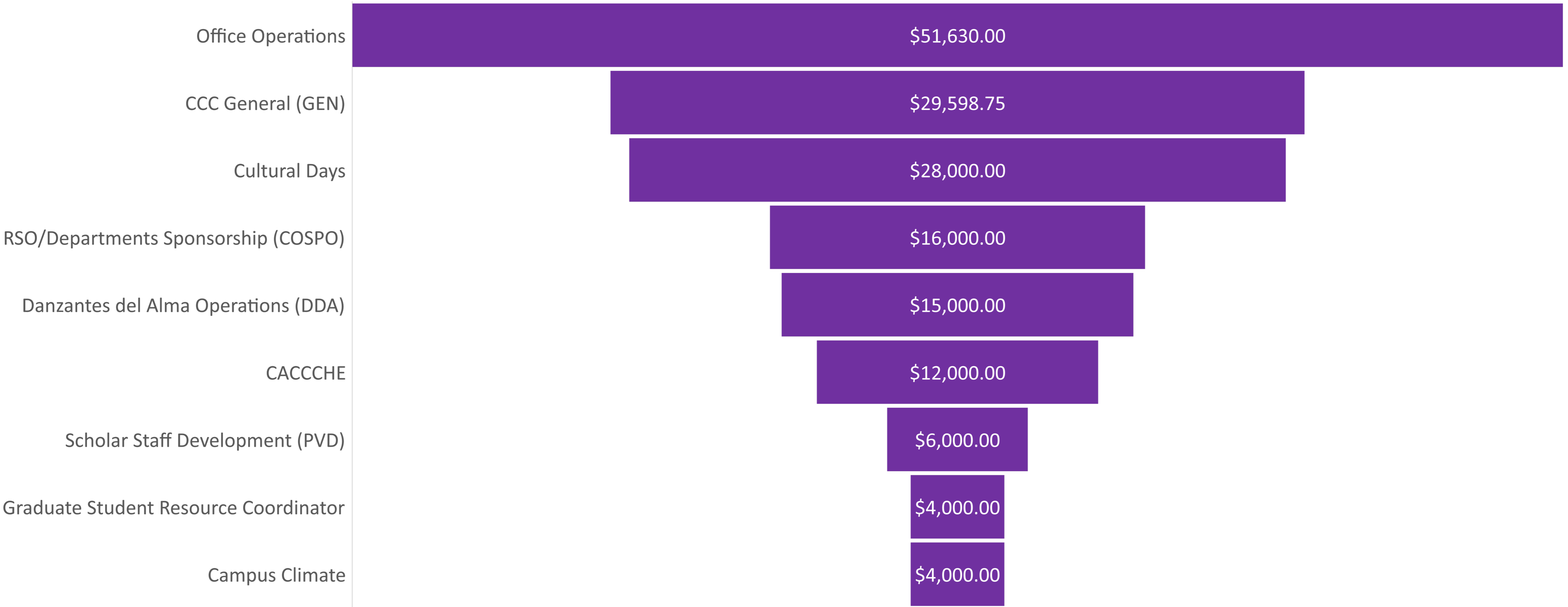




# Allocation of SASI Fund to Programming

**Total visits: 24,385\***

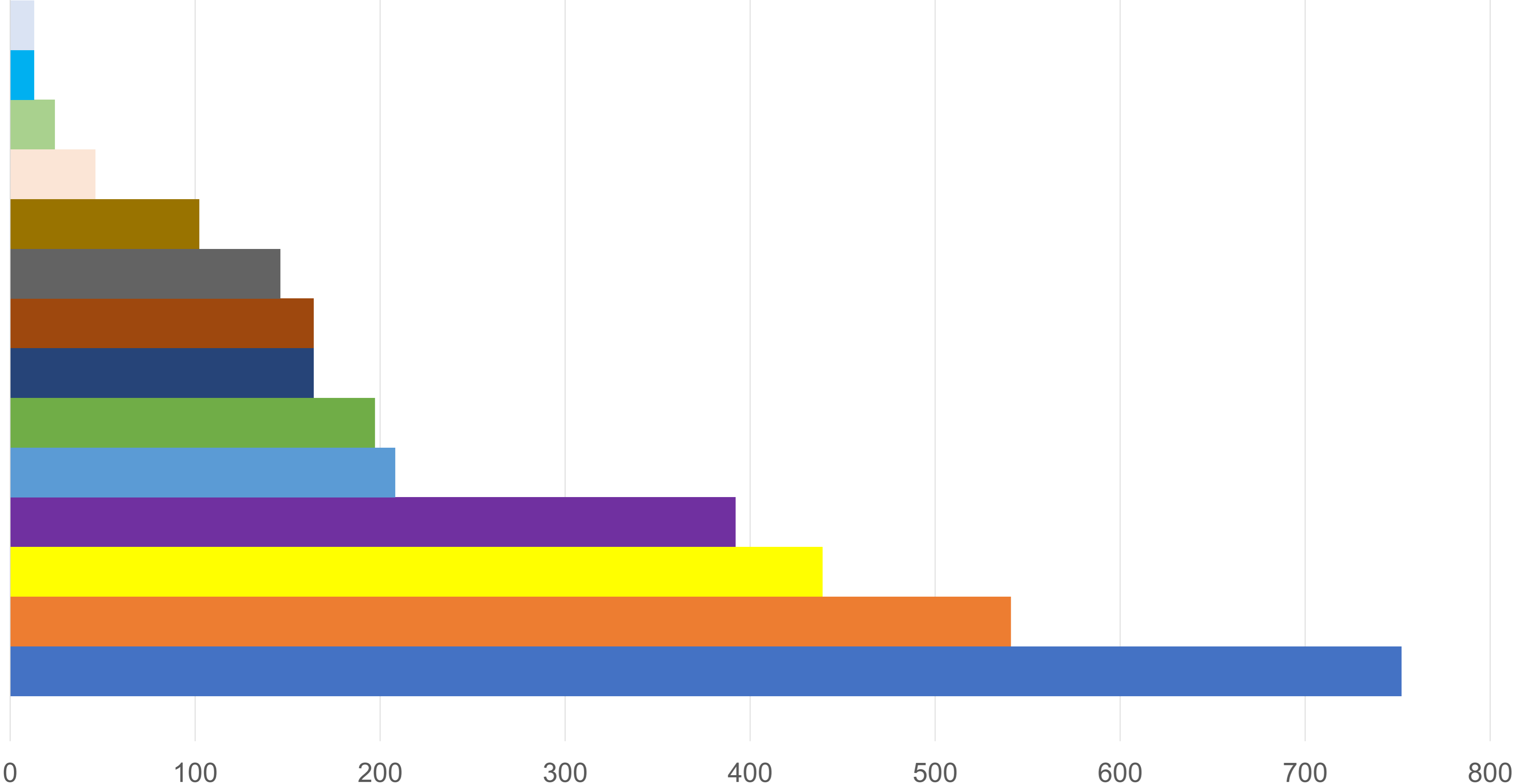

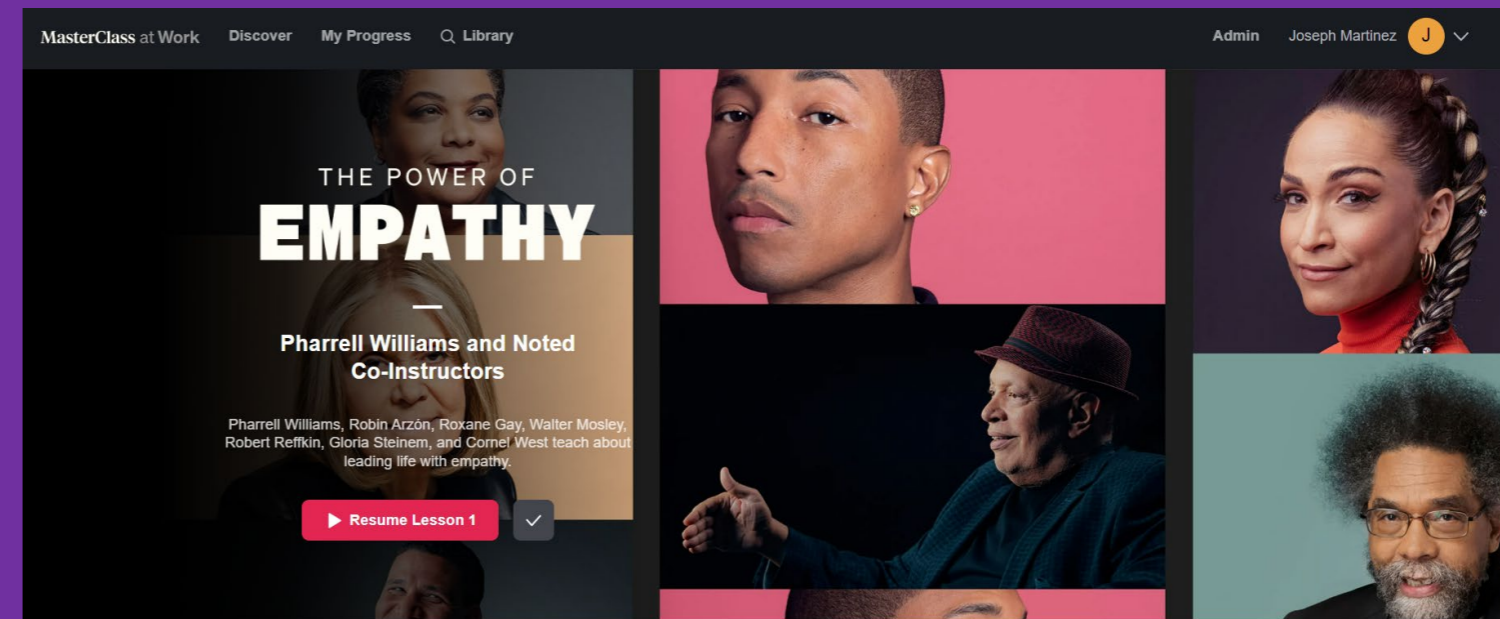
