# IMPACT/CHANGES DUE TO BUDGET CUTS

- Budget Cut by \$76,794
- Eliminated: REACH Retreat, International Retreat, Asian Pacific Islander Leadership Retreat, Student Organizations of Diverse Affiliations, Grants
- Enhanced: Community Specific Programming; Themed Speaker Series; Campus Climate Programming; added a Campus Climate & Community Outreach Coordinator for Whiteness
- Highlighted Main Speakers: Shaun King, Bitter Brown Femmes: Queer Xicano Chisme & Xicanisma, and Kim & Tiq Milan

# INCREASED IMPACT

- 175% jump from 2016-17 (1,193 students) to 2017-18 (3,273) as of 4/13/18
- 1,174 students participated in 45 programs in 2017-18 as of 4/13/18
