Overview of CEI



CEI - Purpose

- Approved in 2002 to support UC Davis' move from Division II to Division 1 athletics.
- Supports Athletics Grant-in-Aid (scholarships) to the level allowed by the NCAA.
- CEI was largely supposed to fully support GIA but after tuition increases in 2009-10, other funds were needed to support GIA.

Overview of Grant-in-Aid



The NCAA allows institutions to award funds to student-athletes based on financial need and athletic contributions to the team.

The NCAA limits both the number of scholarships by sport and the amount awarded.

Scholarship amounts cannot surpass the UC Davis Cost of Attendance.

The number of scholarships varies by sport, as determined by the NCAA. Scholarships in most sports can be split across multiple student-athletes.

Title IX requires that scholarship allocations for men/women be proportional to the number of unduplicated student-athletes.

To receive GIA, student-athletes must be in good academic standing.

Student Athlete Academic Success



- Fall Quarter Academic Update
 - · Overall 3.2 average team GPA
 - · 10% students with a 4.0 GPA
 - · 39% with 3.5 GPA or higher
 - 66% with 3.0 GPA or higher
 - · Average quarterly team GPA over 3.00 for <u>at least 25</u> <u>consecutive</u> quarters.
- Student athletes are currently enrolled in ~70 different academic majors
- Five and Six-year graduation rates for athletes and non-athletes nearly identical

Student-Athlete Success & Fulbright Grant


UC Davis has had three consecutive years for a Student-Athlete to earn a grant from the Fulbright U.S. Student Program!







UCD Student-Athletes vs. Comparison Schools

Overview of CEI Revenues and Expenses




CEI does not cover all the costs of scholarships:

Other fund sources are now needed to support GIA, including gifts and endowments, institutional support, and NCAA revenues.

As tuition/fees/housing costs increase, an even larger gap in our budget will occur.


