Generated Revenue Has Grown Substantially; Temporarily Disrupted by COVID-19

• Fundraising

- \cdot Increased annual fundraising by over 150% since FY16.
- Including capital gifts, fundraising increased from \$2M in FY16 to \$7.2M in FY20.
- ICA led all schools and units in revenue and donors on Give Day 2017, 2018 and 2019.
- First endowed head coaching position in school history in 2017.
- Secured largest gift in UC Davis Athletics history in 2018.

• Ticket Sales

• Ticket revenue increased by 77% from FY17 to FY19; not including football playoff revenues, ticket revenue increased 48%.

· Sponsorship

- Forthcoming announcement of stadium naming rights deal.
- Partnership with Learfield (third party sales agency) to help increase monetization of sponsorship assets.

• Game Guarantees

• Generated all time high of almost \$1.5M in revenue from game guarantees in 18-19.

We are frugal and vigilant about controlling expenses.

- Campus per diem limit is \$62; ICA is \$30.
- Campus lodging cap is \$275/night. We budget at \$145/night (2 per hotel room).
- ICA staffing very lean and staff generally make less than other parts of campus.
- -Administrative budgets have been reduced annually by 2-5% for the past three years.
- -Increased costs are generally due to inflationary increases for salary/benefits, scholarships, travel and equipment, as well as investments in facilities and student-focused initiatives.

How COVID-19 is Affecting Our Finances

- Anticipate a reduction in revenue of nearly \$3M:
 - · Game Guarantees: -\$1.1M
 - · Ticket Revenue: -\$688K
 - · Development: -\$550K
 - · NCAA Revenues: -\$441K
 - Sponsorships (Pepsi): -\$59K
 - · Total Loss: \$2.8M

• Loss in revenue offset by following expenditure reductions:

- · Sport Budgets: -\$1.5M (reduced travel, other savings)
- · Salary and Benefits: -\$700K (no pay raises, keeping positions open)
- · Administrative/Other Savings: -\$600K (various actions)
- · Total reductions: \$2.8M

Our coaching salaries are modest and appropriately sized for the FCS level of D1.

Assistant coaches made an average of \$54K in 2019-20.

CEI is used to cover athletic scholarships

- The NCAA limits both the number of scholarships by sport and the amount awarded.
- Scholarship amounts cannot surpass the UC Davis Cost of Attendance.
- The number of scholarships varies by sport, as determined by the NCAA. Scholarships in most sports can be split across multiple studentathletes.
- Title IX requires that scholarship allocations for men/women be proportional to the number of unduplicated student-athletes.

UC Davis will always have higher scholarship expenses than peers because of the number of teams we have and the relative price of UC tuition and fees.

In 2019-20, UC Davis had 621 unduplicated student athletes, 466 of which received some form of scholarship.

CEI does not cover all of the costs for scholarships...

- CEI covered about 88% of the \$8.3M in scholarship expenses in 2019-20.
- Other sources of funding include endowments and private gifts (2%), institutional support (6%), and NCAA revenues (4%).

And as tuition/fees/housing costs increase, an even larger gap in our budget will occur.

Demographics of athletics scholarship recipients include significant percentages of students from traditionally underrepresented backgrounds:

- 52.9% White/Caucasian
- · 15.5% Two or more races
- · 13.9% Black/African American
- **7.6% Asian**
- · 7.0% Hispanic
- · 1.7% Pacific Islander
- · 0.4% American Indian/Alaska Native
- · 0.9% Unknown

Why is CEI important for UC Davis overall?

- CEI is part of funding a successful D1 Athletics program.
- Successful athletics at the D1 level creates significant exposure, alumni engagement, and other benefits for UC Davis.

ICA works with campus partners to pursue *institutional* opportunities.

- Community-building for students, staff, and City of Davis residents.
 - · Approximately 120,000 people attend ICA events in a given year.
- Visibility for all of UC Davis.
 - Over 4M people watched UC Davis in 2017 NCAA Tournament.
 - · Messaging on sports broadcasts promotes broad academic strengths.
- Alumni engagement and fundraising opportunities.
 - · Chancellor May and DEVAR use athletics events for fundraising opportunities
- Other collaborative partnerships with campus groups
 - Temporary location for the ASUCD Pantry during COVID-19





