Please provide the amount of **CEI** reserves (if any) and plans to use reserves for anticipated project or expenses:

No reserves. The original intent was for Grant-in-Aid to be fully covered by CEI. However, for a number of reasons, including tuition increases far exceeding the rate of growth in CEI, CEI does not fully cover Grant-in-Aid, and we have had to find other sources of funding in order to appropriately fund Grant-in-Aid. As such, we fully expend all CEI on an annual basis.

Please describe the need for a CPI adjustment and include the departmental plan if CPI is not applied for next year:

As noted above, ICA has already had to supplement CEI funding in order to fund Grant-in-Aid, despite the intent of CEI to fully support Grant-in-Aid. Not receiving the CPI adjustment would further exacerbate this issue, especially in light of tuition and other cost-of-living increases. ICA does not have other resources available in the event that CPI is not applied. ICA would have to consider significant reductions in both future Grant-in-Aid awards and other areas, which would seriously impact UC Davis' ability to be competitive at the Division 1 level.
