Section 1a: 10 student assist 4's are budgeted to support Campus Rec. Included in the 23-24 budget is a \$.50 hourly increase beginning in Jan '24. Scheduled labor hours increased from 3,300 in 22-23 to 3,800 in 23-24.

Section 1b: Additional funding in 23-24 to support end of year Sports Banquet and Nationals expenses.

3. If applicable, please provide plans for use of reserves listed in section #1f:

The current reserve fund balance is \$1.1M. This has been saved over the past ten years to be used for the Dairy Field Turf replacement. We plan to replace the turf this year and use up all of the reserves. It is important that we begin to build up the reserves again so we can replace the turf when it is needed again.

4. Please describe the need for a consumer price index (CPI) adjustment and include the departmental plan if CPI is not applied next academic year.

A measure eligible to hit the ballot in Nov '24 will further increase and accelerate California's minimum wage beginning in January '25, impacting the 24-25 fiscal year. The last measure passed in 2021, increasing minimum wage annually through January '24 by \$.50 per hour.

Overall inflation has steadied to a current rate inflation rate of 3% which is expected to continue into next year.

With the CPI increase our goal is to continue to increase the funding for Nationals for the Sport Clubs, add to the student payroll to cover the wage increases as well as add to the reserves for the replacement of dairy field turf in the future.
