While cohort-based tuition and fees provide some stability, tuition and fees continue to increase for first year students which ultimately leads to cost increases for ICA. A CPI adjustment will assist ICA in managing the cost increase. If CPI is not applied next year, ICA will need to increase reliance on other fund sources to cover scholarships and/or reduce scholarship allocations (which contradicts the language in the original referendum).

The CEI fee provided athletic scholarship support to 482 student-athletes in 2022-23 across all 25 sports and helped attract students from diverse backgrounds to UC Davis.
