RE: Campus Based Fees for 2020-21

Dear IVC Galindo and VC Ratliff,

The Council on Student Affairs and Fees (COSAF) has spent this year reviewing the use of campus-based fees by departments who receive the funding. These reviews were conducted to assure appropriate use of the revenue and to determine whether to recommend CPI adjustments for those fees eligible.

The attached documents provided by Budget & Institutional Analysis reflects a comprehensive look at 2020-21 fees based on COSAF recommendations. The report includes recommended **CPI adjustments** for **CEI**, **FACE**, **LEEAP**, **California Aggie** and **GSA**. Also, **SASI** fee recipients presented this year and the Council has provided their recommendations to the departments. Per referendum language, SASI receives an automatic CPI adjustment.

In addition, COSAF has completed a review of **The Green Initiative Fee** (TGIF) revenue and the TGIF committee governing process. Per referendum language, TGIF does not receive a CPI adjustment. It is worth noting that **TGIF** and the **California Aggie** fee will sunset after academic school year 2020-21.

This year COSAF reviewed and provided ballot language recommendations for the ASUCD **Basic Needs and Services Referendum**. This referendum, which increases the ASUCD base fee, was passed by the student body during Winter elections and will take effect Fall 2020.

We have listed all fees separately for undergraduate students, who will see a proposed **\$158.11** total increase in campus-based fees and graduate/professional students, who will see a proposed **\$33.48** increase.

As COSAF co-chairs, we will soon be producing an annual report that will further describe the activities of the 2019-20 Council with detailed COSAF recommendations, including input on five **Student Services Fee** department presentations and allocation of \$100,000 in **Student Programming Funds**. We hope you will find these recommendations helpful to Student Affairs and FOA in its efforts to create a positive and meaningful campus experience for every UC Davis student.

COSAF looks forward to our partnership with you next year as we continue to listen and understand students' views on issues concerning the use of student fees here at UC Davis. Thank you.
