Recap on The Green Initiative Fund

- Provide funds to UC Davis students, faculty, and staff to develop and lead projects to enhance campus sustainability measures. Projects must have undergraduate involvement and/or benefits.
- Quarterly student fee established by a Winter Quarter 2016 Student Referendum
 - \$3 undergrad fees started collecting Fall 2016
 - Grant cycles started Fall 2017
- Committee members voting: 6 students, 1 staff; non-voting, ex-officio: 1 COSAF, 1 ASUCD-EPPC, 2
 Sustainability Office

TGIF Grant Process

- Award Amounts \$200 to \$20,000
- 3 Grant Cycles Annually
- Array of Topics 17 UN SDGs
 - Food Security and Recovery
 - Farming & Gardens
 - Habitat Restoration & Native Landscaping
 - Climate Neutrality
 - **Environmental &** Climate Justice
 - **Energy Conservation &** Efficiency

TGIF Grants - Example Highlight

DIY Eco Materials Library

- Goals: Educational library of eco materials; sustainable design
- ❖ 1st place Role Model Award Winner
 - Parson School of Design









Current Status

- Over 100 projects funded since 2017
- ~\$650,000 in funding distributed to date
- TGIF Committee currently managing ~40 active awards
- Prior to pandemic, AY 2019-20
 - Proposal requests totaling ~\$535,000
 - Awards totaled ~\$295,000
- During pandemic AY 2020-21
 - Proposal requests totaling ~\$191,000
 - Awards totaled ~\$110,000

*** 3rd year of proposal solicitation***

Continued demand, in spite of disruptions

TGIF Growth & Improvement

- Challenges and opportunities due to and in spite of the pandemic
 - Increased complexity of project management duties (e.g. project changes, timeline extensions, ensuring appropriate stewardship of TGIF student fees)
 - Continuous improvement of policies & procedures, "real-time" decision making
- Enhanced outreach and social media



The Future of TGIF

- Ratified in 2016, expired in Spring 2021, fee no longer collected
- Spring 2021 referendum did not have a high-enough voter turnout to pass (though 2/3rds majority of those voting were in favor)
- Stewarding remaining funds to manage through AY 2022-23
 - No new grants will be given, post Spring 2022 grant cycle
- Future depends on the outcome of fee renewal
 - Now Fall 2022; collection not until Fall 2023
- If referendum fails...
 - TGIF sunsets in AY 2022-23
- If referendum passes...
 - Invest in maximizing grant management efficiency
 - Enhance outreach, partnership, & collaboration
 - Increase grant opportunities

Bridging TGIF: Maintaining Operations

Important considerations

- Continue to steward remaining student fees appropriately
 - Provide oversight to projects to ensure adherence to TGIF and UCD fiscal policies
 - ▶ Manage through *many* lingering disruptions of pandemic
- Maintain TGIF Committee as required by Bylaws

Bridging AY 2021-22 (currently)

- ▶ Still soliciting proposals and offering funding *at reduced levels*
- Using carryforward and pandemic cost-savings to fund awards this AY
- Outreach campaign for broadening TGIF awareness in preparation for referendum

Bridging AY 2022-23 (next year)

- ▶ No new grant proposals are planned to be funded
- Using carryforward to maintain grant manager and TGIF Committee to continue to support existing projects through completion

Referendum: TGIF Fee Renewal Reinstatement Spring 2021 Fall 2022



Note

- Very modest initial increase in fee; from \$3/quarter to \$3.50/quarter
- Previously, no increase since 2016 when originally ratified
- Referendum in Fall 2022, but collection would not start until Fall 2023
