More importantly, CSI staff assists all organizations to navigate policies and procedures related to funding, event planning and reservations, and provide support with leadership development, and organizational growth and management. Additionally, our office also serves as the support staff in Student Affairs for freedom of expression response, consulting, and advocacy.

# 3. Please provide information regarding the benefit to UC Davis students from the departmental program(s) or service(s) specifically funded by the Student Services Fee.

As of June 30, 2019, there are 783 Registered Student Organizations (RSOs), and two councils or boards engaged with the Center for Student Involvement (CSI). These various organizations serve undergraduate, graduate, and professional school students at both the Davis and Health campus. Based on CSI's AggieLife\* data the total number of self-reported members in all 783 RSOs was 12,502.

According to Evans et al. (2009), when a student is involved on campus they are more likely to stay in college, and be successful in life after college. The UC Davis Center for Student Involvement data supports this as well.

In February 2019 CSI administered a student organization involvement survey to all members of RSOs with 1,067 responses. Highlights from the results include:

- **75%** of the undergraduate respondents are upper division students.
- **75%** of the respondents served as officer for one organization.
- **68%** of respondents have served as officers from six months to two years.
- 51% of respondents spend between 1 and 5 hours in their role as an officer.
- **95**% of respondents reported involvement in a student organization has helped them connect on campus.
- **81%** of respondents reported leadership role has helped with time management, exposure to academic interests and career opportunities and prioritizing studies first.

**92**% of respondents reported increases in competencies because of their experience as a student organization officer.

## Question(s):

Related to 2018-19/2019-20 chart: Total expenses went down by nearly \$400,000. How were you able to reduce expenses so much?

#### Response:

The total expenses for FY18-19 includes \$150K of CES registration fees paid by the division for the Registered Student Organizations, as well as onetime cost for the Aggie Software purchase of \$115K. The FY19-20 CSI budget includes hiring 1 FTE Admin Asst, however \$225K for the Greek Life program was inadvertently not included in the total. The Greek Life staff and operations transferred from Student Housing to CSI.
