Program Highlights

Success Coaching - Coaches use a strengths-based approach to support the student's exploration of the habits, priorities, values, and challenges that may be impacting their college experience.

First-Year Aggie Connections - Creating connections both in and out of class is an essential part of the first-year student experience and for building success at UC Davis. An FYAC connection is made up of 25 students or fewer that share a common interest/theme for one academic quarter.

Reentry Student Services - Dedicated staff and support services for students 25+ years, student parents, and caregivers.

Special Transitional Enrichment Program (STEP) offers writing, math and general education courses during SSI and SSII

1st of Many Educational Initiative - Retention effort that promotes community, identity development and civic engagement for first generation students. Initiative includes living learning communities and outreach to families.
