Program Highlights

Second-Year Retreat is an experiential program that is designed to assist in the ongoing mission of supporting the self-efficacy and persistence of second-year students. The retreat consisted of a full day of activities that included, peer-to-peer engagement, professional development seminars and learning strategies workshops.

The OEOES Summer Research Fellowship is a collaborative program designed for OEOES program scholars to engage in a research experience with a faculty mentor. The scholars participate in weekly professional development seminars and share their work in a symposium at the end of the summer program experience.

Transfer Retention Specialist - New career staff position that supports student parent and reentry student populations. Significant programming, outreach, and campus collaborations have been developed as a result of having this position including a Student Parent website, Reentry Retreat, and obtaining priority registration for student parents and caregivers.

Special Transitional Enrichment Program (STEP) - Begins with a six-week residential program for 249 incoming freshman. Offers writing, math, general education and new for 2022 chemistry.

First Generation College Celebration (FGCC) Is an annual opportunity to raise awareness of the first generation college student identity. EOP kicked off the celebration by gathering
