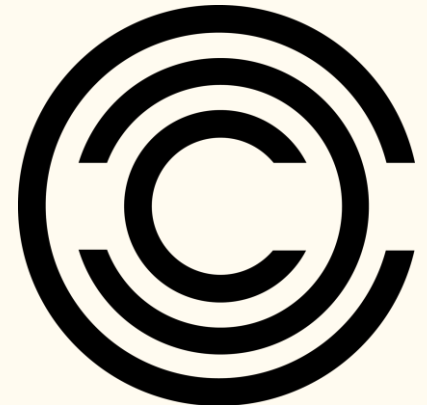
MISSION

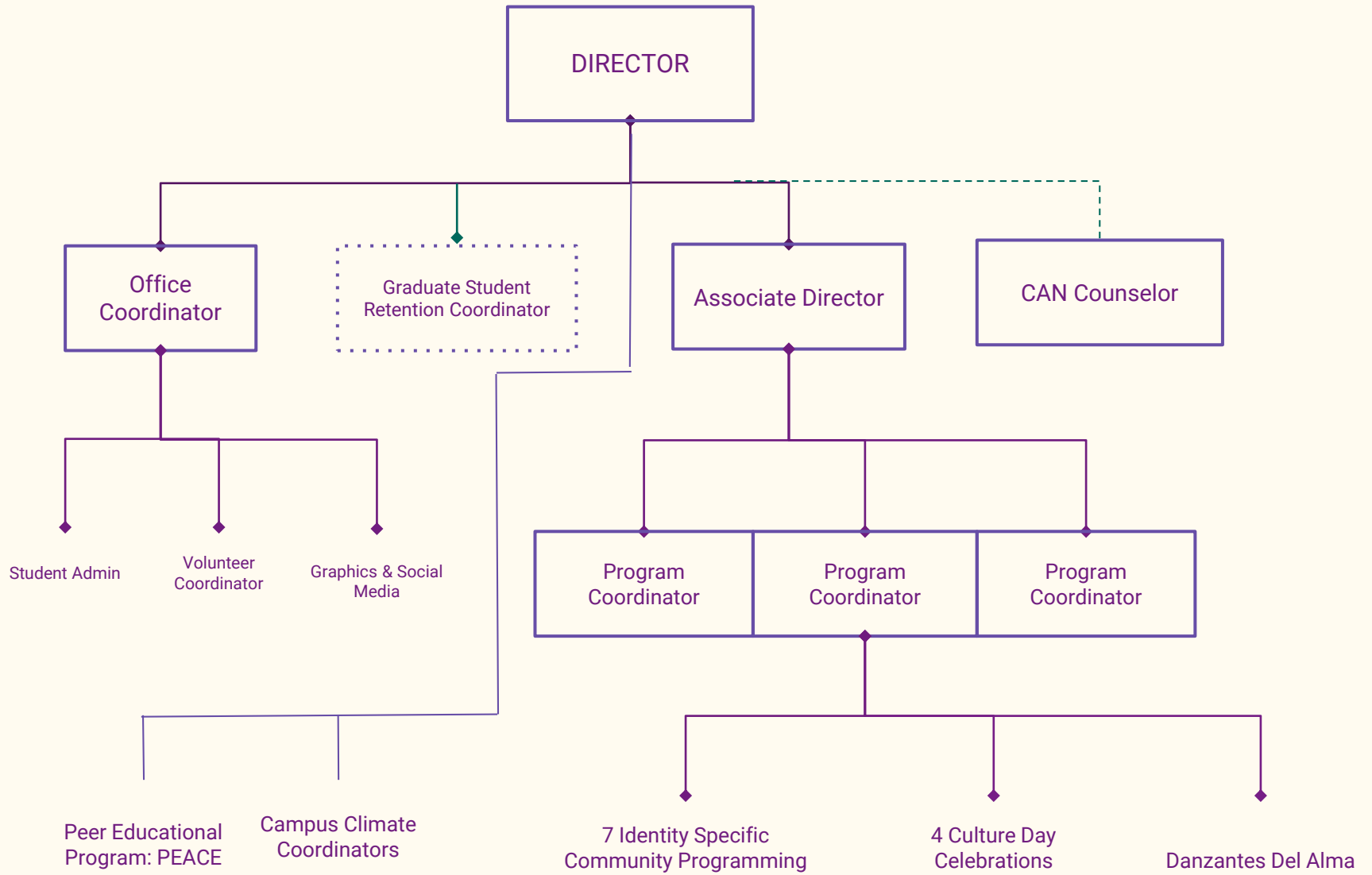

2019-2020 FUNDING SOURCES

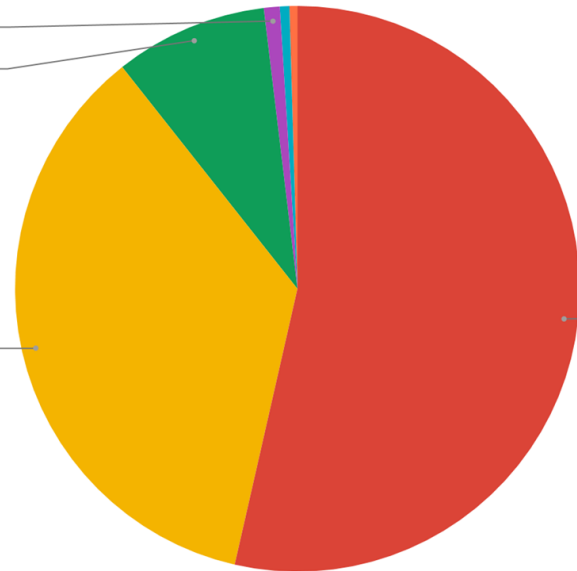

Cultural Appropriation

CREATING A MORE JUST & LIBERATED WORLD



WHAT IS APPROPRIATION

Cultural appropriation involves taking an aspect of another community's culture: art, clothing, designs, language, symbols, etc., without recognizing the historical context in which it came from.

Cultural appropriation might also involve stereotyping a community or identity in a way that harmfully effects that community.



TIPS TO END APPROPRIATION

Recognize History

Wearing costumes that have cultural value to marginalized communities ignores and invalidates their histories and the power dynamics at play.

Fight the Stereotypes

Stereotyping a community can perpetuate harmful stigmas and notions that result in discrimination towards members of those communities.

Know Who Profits

Many companies profit off of people's cultures while authentic products made by actual members of those communities go ignored and not supported.
