The Powwow at UC Davis started in 1969. It is a gathering that honors and celebrates Native Culture. The hxstory of powwow/s on the Davis campus dates back to the rising presence of Native American students, staff, and faculty on campus. The first powwow/s on campus were at their core small gatherings where different generations of Native peoples shared song and dance.

Over time, the growing Native American community on campus advocated for and contributed to the development of Native American Studies, the Tecumseh Center, Native American Cultural Days, and the UC Davis Powwow.

UC Davis Powwow Today




