Program Overview

- Family support service managed by WorkLife
- 2013 Chancellor's charge: improve child care experience for student parents
 - ASE-contract Child Care Reimbursement (Graduate Studies)
 - Child Care Grant (Financial Aid)
 - Child Care Subsidy (WorkLife)
- Restructured programs, funding models, delivery systems
 - ↓ Administration → Single point of contact
 - ↑ Coordination & Communication
 - ↑ Type of eligible child care providers
 - ↑ Age of eligible children

Two Types of Grants

Graduate Student Grant

- Graduate and professional students (excluding self-supporting programs)
- Not financial need-based
- Academic year enrollment; summer session ASE employment
- Amount per student parent
- Disbursed by Financial Aid to student account

Community Based Care Grant

- Undergraduate, graduate and professional students (excluding self-supporting programs)
- Financial need-based
- Academic year enrollment; no summer session
- Amount per child by age
- Disbursed by Financial Aid to student account

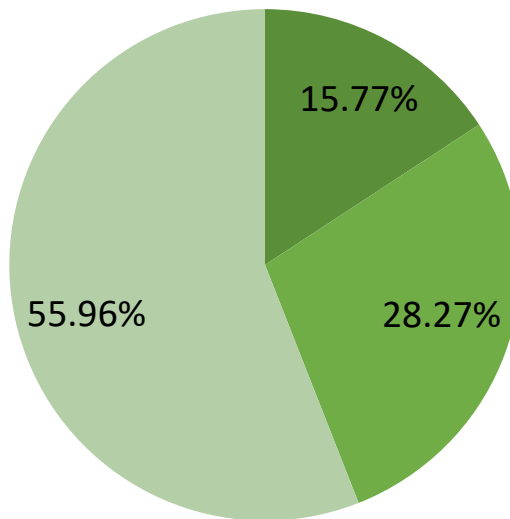

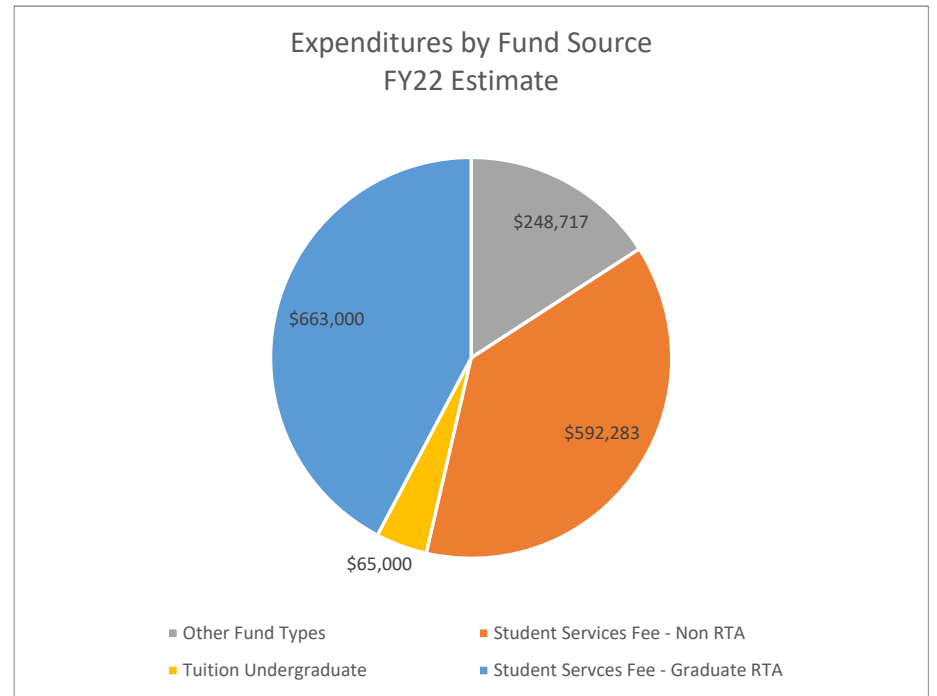
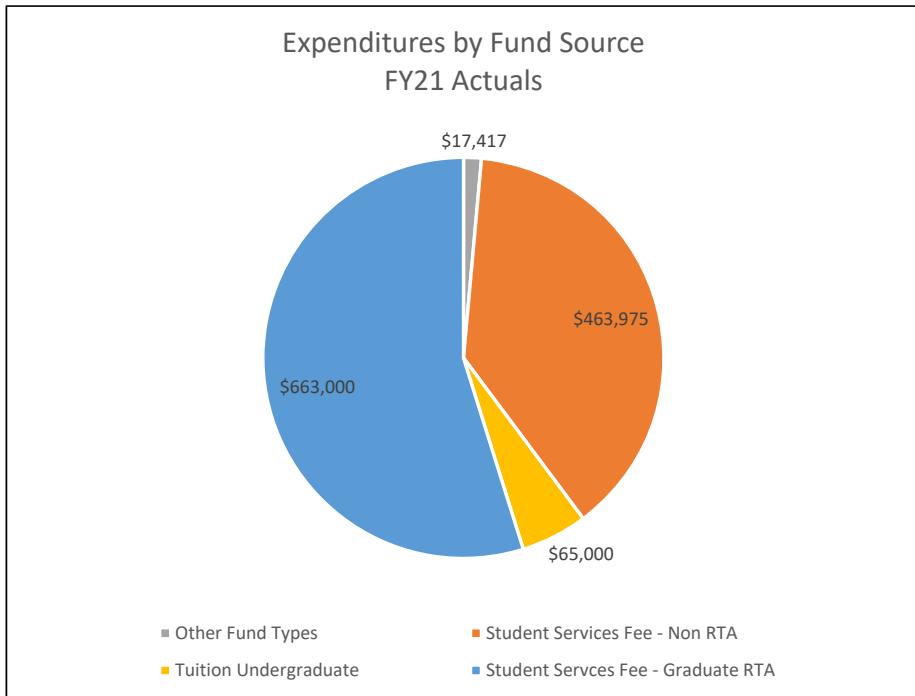

■ CBCG ■ GSCCG ■ Student Parent

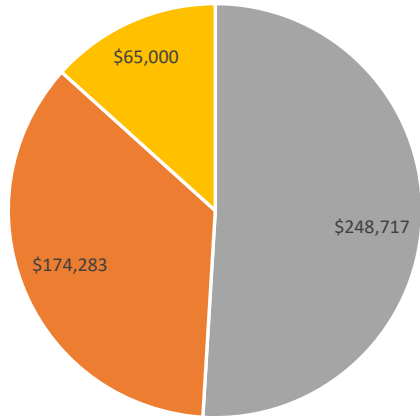


Expenditures by Funding Source



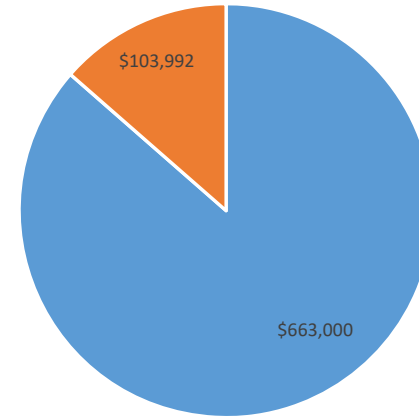
Expenditures by Grant

■ Other Fund Types ■ Student Services Fee - Non RTA ■ Tuition Undergraduate

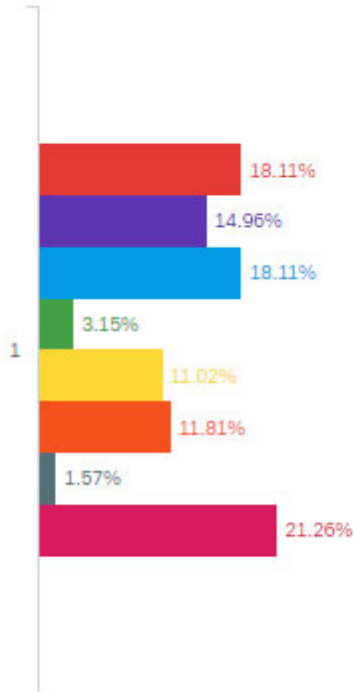
Graduate Student Child Care Grant

How has the UC Davis Student Parent Child Care Funding Program affected your experience at UC Davis? (mark all that apply)

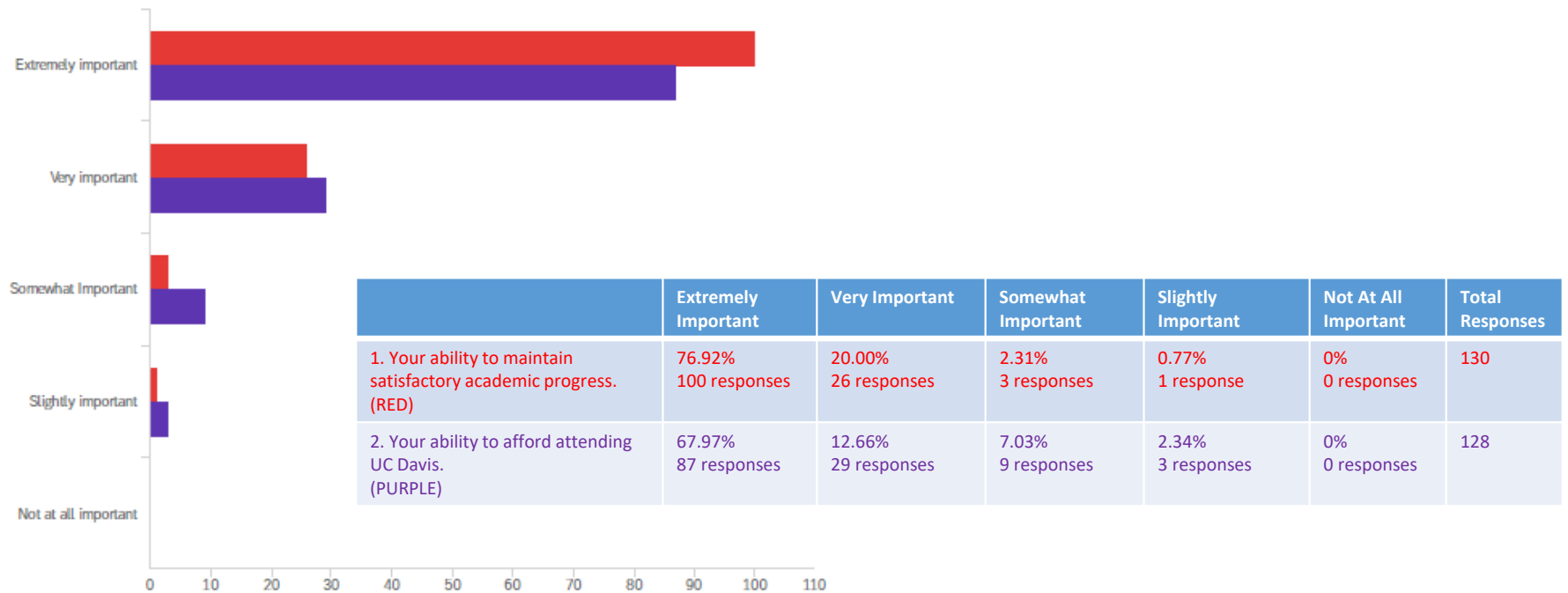
