### ICA Responsible Stewardship




## ICA has significantly increased generated revenues in recent years, including:

- Increased annual fundraising in FY22 19% over prior year
- Total Operating gifts hit \$1M in FY22 vs \$850K FY21
- Including capital gifts, fundraising increased from \$2M in FY16 to \$6M+ in FY21.
- FY22 ticket revenues increased 22% over FY20 (last non-COVID year)
- FY22 other revenues, such as camps, game guarantees, and conference distributions increased 35% over FY20 (last non-COVID year).


### ICA operates in a very lean manner that presents some challenges:

- Administrative budgets have been reduced annually by 2-5% over the past four years. Note: part of FY20, all FY21 impacted by COVID
- ICA staffing very lean, with nearly 25% of our non-coach positions being filled by \$35K fellowship positions.
- Head coach salaries generally lower than conference average.
- Assist. coaches make an average of \$57K.
- Have no administrative assistants within the entire athletic department.
- Campus per diem limit is \$69; ICA is \$40.
- Campus lodging cap is \$275/night; we budget at \$150/night (2 per room).


### **Head Coach Compensation FY23**




# ICA Budget Overview




- Total expenses are nearing \$40M, averaging 6% annual growth.
- Decreasing support from student fees as % of total sources, from 73% to 67% over 3-year period.
- About 70-75% of budget is spent on Financial Aid, Personnel, or Debt Service, while just 25-30% is Operating Expense.


