Recap on The Green Initiative Fund

- Provide funds to UC Davis students, faculty, and staff to develop and lead projects to enhance campus sustainability measures. Projects must have undergraduate involvement and/or benefits.
- Quarterly student fee established by a Winter Quarter
 2016 Student Referendum
 - \$3 undergrad fees started collecting Fall 2016
 - Grant cycles started Fall 2017
- Committee members voting: 7 students, 1 staff; non-voting, ex-officio: 1 COSAF, 1 ASUCD-EPPC, 2
 Sustainability Office

TGIF Grant Process

- Award Amounts \$200 to \$20,000
- 3 Grant Cycles Annually
- Array of Topics 17 UN SDGs
 - Food Security and Recovery
 - Farming & Gardens
 - Habitat Restoration & Native Landscaping
 - Climate Neutrality
 - Environmental & Climate Justice

Covid-19: Challenges & Opportunities

- Almost all projects are on hold
- Increased complexity of project management duties
 - ▶ Timeline extensions
 - Budget reallocations
 - Shifts in Project Leads
 - Implementation challenges
- Currently active grants have almost tripled
 - New proposals funded during pandemic, timeline extension of previously funded projects

- Complex project management demands has led to
 - Improved procedures & efficiencies
 - Impressive collaboration amongst TGIF Committee
 - New adaptations and innovations applicable to beyond the pandemic

The Future of TGIF

- Depends on the outcome of fee renewal
 - May 10-13, ASUCD Elections
- If referendum fails...
 - Another renewal attempt when possible
- If referendum passes...
 - Invest in maximizing grant management efficiency
 - Enhance outreach, partnership, & collaboration
 - Increased grant opportunities, maximum grant awards


