New Initiatives & Highlights

Success Coaching - Coaches use a strengths-based approach to support the student's exploration of the habits, priorities, values, and challenges that may be impacting their college experience.

2nd Year Summit - Services developed to address students' struggles with uncertainty e.g. establishing identity, finding purpose and achieving success.

Financial Readiness - Workshops and activities to help students build knowledge and skills to make informed and fiscally responsible decisions.

Hooves for Heroes – Therapeutic and wellness program for veteran students. Offered in partnership with Campus Recreation and the Equestrian Center.

Food Security Partnership - Center for Opportunity Scholars is a food distribution site for UC Davis Student Farm and point of contact for CalFresh.

1st of Many Educational Initiative - Retention effort that promotes community, identity development and civic engagement for first generation students. Initiative includes living learning communities and outreach to families.
