Career staff salaries increased 6% from 2017-18 - this is due to merit increases and positions filled due to staff turnover. Student salaries and general expense increased by 18% due to the minimum wage increase as well as the additional students needed to operate programs and facilities with our growing student population.

The CPI adjustment funds the increase in student salaries due to the minimum wage increases happening until 2021 when the minimum wage reaches \$15/hr. Without these funds, we would have to scale back services to students in the form of available hours or programming based on not being able to afford the additional payroll expenses.

Based on Aggie Swipe date approximately 78% of UC Davis undergraduates use recreational programs and facilities. Our facilities had well over 1 million visits in 17-18. The ARC alone had an increase of 31,000 swipe-ins during a time where we have limited space due to construction.
The Memorial Union sees foot traffic of over 1 million people through the union in a year. The specific programs supported by SASI are open to all students.
