### **Cabinet of Student Leaders**

The Vice Chancellor's Cabinet of Student Leaders is an initiative developed in partnership between the Vice Chancellor for Student Affairs (VCSA) and Vice Chancellor Fellow, where student leaders engage in dialogue with the VCSA and other student leaders representing a diverse range of groups and departments across our campus. A total of 32 student representatives serving as student leaders and members of student advisory boards serve on the cabinet. ## **Student Affairs Challenges & Opportunities**

- Evaluating impact of one time, \$8.5M budget redirection of SSF and COFI resulting in reductions and/or shifting to other sources where appropriate.
- \$708k in permanent funding to support our Foster Youth Program (Guardian Scholars).
- \$623k in new permanent funding plus an existing \$350k in funding to serve undocumented students.
- \$490k in permanent funding to establish and sustain the Underground Scholars Program for incarcerated, formerly incarcerated and carceral system-impacted students.
- Forthcoming: increase in funding for disability student services, basic needs, and mental health.
