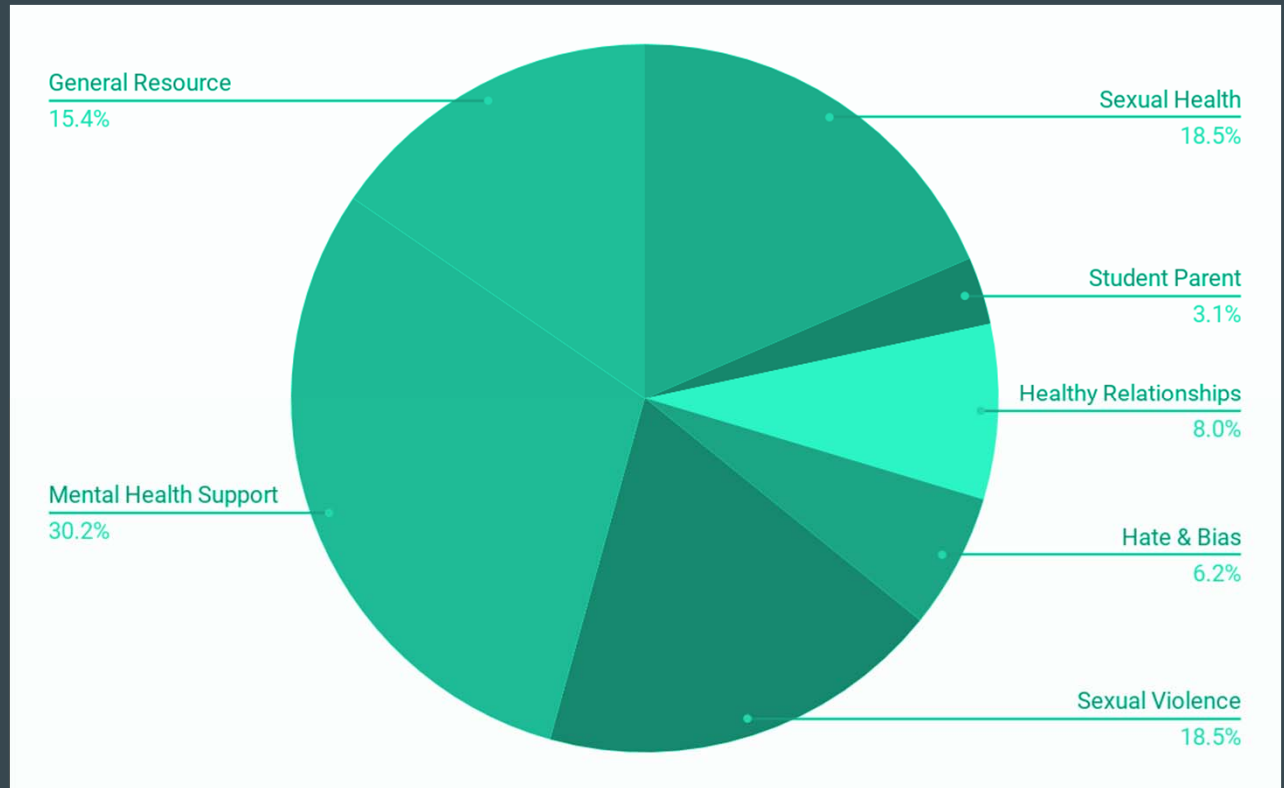

CPI Adjustment Plans
