

Q1 Please indicate your student status:






Q3 Are you an International Student?


Q4 Indicate the age(s) of your children in child care: (mark all that apply)







Q5 Which type(s) of funding did you receive? (mark all that apply)





Q6 How has the UC Davis Student Parent Child Care Funding Program affected your experience at UC Davis? (mark all that apply)





Q7 What percentage of your child care costs were covered by the UC Davis Student Parent Child Care Funding Program?






